HISTORY

The City of Oaks Foundation was originally created in 2010 to help deliver this hidden natural treasure as a gift from the late William and Mary Coker Joslin to the people of Raleigh. The four and one-half acres of rolling hills and gardens overflow with streams, wildlife, and a diverse collection of rare and native plants. While the pandemic slowed down this process, great progress was made in 2020 toward transforming this private property into a public park and garden in 2021.

TAKING A PAUSE

Unfortunately many of the City of Oaks Foundation's signature events at Joslin Garden had to be cancelled in 2020 due to the pandemic. In their place, the City of Oaks Foundation offered "Virtual" Open Garden Days and a limited number of smaller outdoor events following strict safety protocols while Joslin Garden provided a personal respite for those seeking a secluded and meditative natural space. The Foundation renewed its commitment to help provide community assistance during the pandemic, growing and donating fresh food from Joslin Garden for Logan Trading Company's "Plant a Row for the Hungry" program.

Kellam-Wyatt Farm Preserve

PRESERVING TRADITION, PROTECTING THE FUTURE

The Kellam-Wyatt Farm Preserve, a lush 60-acre property featuring woods, lakes and trails, had been in Bob Kellam's family for generations. Bob Kellam and Susan Wyatt preserved the property as a farm and sanctuary to hundreds of plants and animals, while neighboring lots were sold and developed into subdivisions and shopping centers.

Bob and Susan envisioned that the farm could become a place for environmental education and sustainable farming and worked through the City of Oaks Foundation to protect the land with a conservation easement. Through the efforts of the City of Oaks Foundation to promote Bob and Susan's vision, the Wake County Commission accepted donation of the farm in 2018 as the Kellam-Wyatt Farm Preserve, a future park, nature preserve and community agricultural site to share with future generations.

VISION TO REALITY

Wake County has initiated a multi-year master planning process to transform Bob and Susan's vision into reality. This planning process is important because it allows the County to engage the public and ensure that the new park and nature preserve fills community needs. Planning is expected to continue through 2021. The City of Oaks Foundation remains an engaged partner in this master planning process, monitoring the conservation easement on the property and advocating for the Kellam-Wyatt Farm Preserve's future.

Through our Give Play program, the City of Oaks Foundation partners with Raleigh's Parks, Recreation & Cultural Resources Department to provide financial aid to Raleigh area families so that local children can attend active, outdoor summer camps connected to nature.

During the time frame covered by this report, many children benefited from these camps in July and August of 2019, but camps were canceled in June of 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Thankfully most program sponsors have allowed us to hold this money for use in 2021, when we hope to support a record number of campers!
